Please note South African passport holders can get the visa on arrival but only if arriving at Queen Alia International Airport. If arriving at any other ports of entry then a visa is required prior to arrival.

Please note that Kenyan and Zambian passports are on a restricted passport list and therefor the embassy cannot issue visas. For Business the inviting company or conference organizers need to apply to the Ministry of Interior in Jordan for visas. For tourism the client will need to make arrangements through a Jordanian Travel/Tourism Agency who will apply to the Ministry of Interior in Jordan for you.

➤ Valid passport (must be valid for at least six months after returning from Jordan)

Temporary passports will be accepted, provided the passport is less than six weeks old

A certified copy of the ID Book is also required

- One colour photograph
- > Itinerary

# **Special Requirements for Tourist**

> South African employment letter

➤ If on a tour, letter from tour operator and itinerary dating which sides they are going to visit and who is leading the group in Jordan.

# **Special Requirements for Business**

- > South African business letter
- > Invitation letter from the Company in Jordan

### **Minors**

Notarized parental consent is required for persons under 18 years of age if they are not traveling with a parent or legal guardian, OR if they are traveling with one parent only

# **Processing Time**

- ➤ 4 Working days
- ➤ Certain Foreign Passport visa applications will be referred, resulting in a waiting period of 6 to 8 weeks
